#### January – Children's Winter Retreat

The fifth and sixth graders had a great weekend at the Cooperative Baptist Fellowship (CBF) of GA Winter Retreat where they learned how CBF Field Personnel Carson & Laura Foushee are sharing God's love in Japan and how we can be salt and light to the world in our communities here in Georgia.

On Valentine's Day, FBC partnered with the Advanced Treble Ensemble (the Trojan Trebles) from Carrollton High School on mission in town. The Trojan Trebles traveled to Brookdale Senior Living to share Valentine's Day themed music with the residents.

March – Community Easter Egg Hunt

Approximately 200 community members enjoyed inflatables, face paint, a hot dog dinner, AGW ice cream, egg hunts, and the sharing of the true story of Easter.

FBC hosted the 2nd annual Carrollton Choral Festival in conjunction with UWG and other local churches. The UWG Concert Choir performed a short concert of choral classics, followed by the mass choir performing the Faure Requiem.

### April – Love Your Neighbor Day

Sixty individuals of all ages came together to share God's love with our community through a morning of service. We partnered with West Georgia Domestic Violence Shelter, Open Hands, Impact West GA, CASA, and Keep Carroll Beautiful to sort and pack items, paint transitional apartment units, clean up litter, visit our most senior members, and more.



# May – Hymn Festival

The FBC Sanctuary Choir and Orchestra presented a Hymn Festival entitled "Songs of Adoration & Assurance." Orchestra features, choral presentations, and congregational singing filled the sanctuary in a moving worship service.

## June – Vacation Bible School

125 children and 40 volunteers had a great week at VBS while learning that God is our friend.





A team of ten members from First Baptist provided Vacation Bible School for over 300 children in the Santa Elena community. They also packed and distributed food bags for families and visited with the nursing home residents in Siguetepeque.



July – 4<sup>th</sup> of July Parade Refreshments

Refreshments were handed out to the community during the 4th of July parade.

#### August – Village Youth Summit

FBCC volunteers cooked 400 hot dogs and handed out lunches at the back-to-school event.



September – C3 Collection Corner

This allowed for better visibility and increased participation collecting needed items for local partners. So far, the Collection Corner has been utilized for Feeding Families, Open Hands, and Share the Warmth.

FBCC members, joined by the Carrollton Baseball Team, served our community this fall by sorting and organizing items for the Soup Kitchen, doing yard work for a local foster family, decorating cookies and playing Bingo with residents at Laurel Glen, and much more.

Dr. Jessy Togba-Doya, founder of Sustainable Liberia, visited with FBC to fellowship and share the exciting things God has been doing in Liberia.



## October – Perky Pumpkin

Around sixty families came to First Baptist to celebrate the fall season through games, inflatables, a pumpkin carving contest, and dinner from the Varsity.







#### **Fall Concert Series**

FBC presented its first ever Fall Concert Series including three very different yet special worship concert presentations. First in the series was a presentation of piano and organ music led by Greg Hendrix, Justin Tarver, and guest artist Matthew McNeil. Next, a local jazz band Ten 'till Swing shared a sacred jazz service. Finally, a worship team led by Giles Blankenship from Fayetteville, NC came and led worship through familiar hymns, original songs, and contemporary Christian music.

## December – Billy Edwards Sock & Mitten Tree


Collected items were given to JoJo's Closet, providing clothing for children in foster care.
